The learners have been actively engaging in a range of activities, including shopping, swimming, music, arts and crafts, cooking, and more. They have demonstrated enthusiasm and significant progress in developing their independence skills. As the Christmas season approaches, they have started practicing carol songs and creating decorations, which offer meaningful sensory exploration opportunities.

NEURODIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

The interplay between disability and neurodivergence is often misunderstood through the **medical model of disability**, which pathologizes neurodivergence and marginalizes neurominorities. In contrast, the **social model** attributes disability to environmental and societal barriers like neuronormativity and ableism. The neurodiversity paradigm challenges the pathology paradigm, rejecting the idea of a single "normal" brain function. It recognizes all neurological variations as natural and valuable, opposing labels that pathologize neurominorities. While "neurodiversity" encompasses all human minds, "neurodivergence" refers specifically to nontypical neurotypes. Misusing "neurodiverse" for individuals perpetuates neuronormative biases and undermines the neurodiversity movement. The movement critiques harmful practices like applied behavioural analysis (ABA) and rejects performative inclusivity through "neurodiversity lite," which upholds the pathology paradigm. Instead, it seeks to dismantle neuronormativity, promote the

strengths of neurodivergent cultures, and create a society where neurominorities can thrive without being marginalized. It champions equality, inclusion, and recognition of all minds as inherently valuable.



"Autistic Adult Support Strategies"

Autistic individuals have the potential for growth throughout their lives, challenging the misconception that their learning ends after high school. Tailored support and understanding of their unique needs such as sensory processing and communication are essential for their independence and wellbeing. Programs like S.T.E.P.S. focus on engaging activities that build skills, confidence, and social comfort through personalized approaches, such as breaking tasks into small steps and practicing in various settings.

Direct Support Professionals (DSPs) play a critical role in empowering autistic individuals, with campaigns like "MoreThanWork" emphasizing the importance of this career and promoting workforce development. Autism is highly individualized, underscoring the importance of personalized care and advocacy. Continued investment in support programs ensures meaningful growth and better outcomes for individuals with developmental disabilities.
