

Educational

The staff returned to school ahead of the students to prepare and organize classrooms, and participate in refresher training sessions. This academic year is filled with a variety of educational/outdoor activities for the learners, including art and craft, music, swimming and cooking, and more. Motor Skills and Executive Function in Autism

In a recent discussion, Drs. Megan MacDonald and Megan McClelland explored the link between motor skill development and executive function (EF) in autism. They outlined how motor skills, essential for daily activities, and EF, crucial for self-regulation and academic success, both evolve during childhood. They highlighted that children with autism often experience delays in motor skill development but emphasized that these skills are highly malleable and can improve over time. They also discussed how EF and motor skills develop together and how contemporary research is increasingly examining their interconnection, especially in the context of autism.



Kazan from Cube

From the 1997 Canadian science fiction horror-thriller, Cube, Kazan is one of the seven unlucky individuals who finds themselves in the deadly eponymous Kafkaesque maze. Played by Andrew Miller, Kazan is an autistic individual who struggles to communicate with the other characters. Initially considered to be a liability to the others, he is soon recognised as invaluable as he has some knowledge of the traps that fill the maze and reveals himself to be autistic savant with the ability to rapidly and accurately find the number of prime factors in a number. This turns out to be key in helping the others safely navigate the dangerous rooms of the Cube. While we never discover much about Kazan, he demonstrates traits and characteristics often associated with autism, including an aversion to certain colours (he does not like the red rooms) and stimming behaviour.

Autism Passport for Employment

A new "Autism Education Leavers Passport" has been launched to help young autistic people transition from education to employment. Developed by the Disability Advice and Welfare Network (Dawn) and the Suffolk Law Centre, the 35-page booklet offers advice on topics like job interviews and benefits, aiming to address the employment gap for autistic adults, 70% of whom are unemployed. Created with input from autistic individuals, the passport is seen as a valuable resource for both job seekers and employers, helping to promote inclusion and tackle stereotypes about autism in the workplace. **To read more:** Here


